President's Report

Indoor Aviation – Special Interest Group of the Australian Men's Shed

This is the 11th year of operation of Indoor Aviation and the past year has been "business as usual" after the disruptions of Covid in 2020 and 2021.

67 flying days were scheduled in the last half of 2022 and 56 in the first half 2023 and, as previously, in some weeks we have flying at all 4 sites. The staff at all 4 venues have been extremely welcoming and helpful and I would like to record my appreciation for the way in which they have offered excellent support to Ian, Lew, Laurie and Graham in making these venues an outstanding place for us to enjoy our hobby. The formal management body at Mullum has recently changed but it appears as though many of the existing friendly staff remain and we anticipate that things will continue as before. Shane Palmer, the site manager, has left Waverley after many years and I would like to record our appreciation for the exceptional level of support we had at Waverley through his extremely helpful assistance.

The annual John Bird Memorial Trophy for 2022 was held at Waverley on 24 June and this year it will be on Friday, 25th August – again at Waverley. The competition this year is planned to be a trimming contest based on the maximum flight time of a simple timed electric powered glider.
